

AWARDS

Presented to first place winner and ribbons awarded through sixth place for Intro through FEI classes. Championship and Reserve ribbons to highest averaged scores Intro through FEI levels (Freestyle, Equitation, Rider and Young Horse Tests and Materiale excluded). Must ride at least two tests in each show at national levels. High Point ribbons to highest scoring ride in each division. A minimum score of 58% must be earned for High Point or Championship awards.

*For the safety of exhibitors, horses and spectators, **dogs must be leashed at all times** 😊*

GENERAL RULES

Entries must be postmarked by April 30, 2018
(May 5 for online entries only)

*Your entry is **incomplete** if you do not include copies of a **CURRENT COGGINS**
(with your horse's show name on it)
& **CURRENT USEF & USDF** cards (unless in Opportunity/Intro classes).
The fee is **\$20** for incomplete entry!*

Please use www.eqverification.org to print your cards
Choose "print verification", then "select an affiliate", choose USDF,
then input your information

Entries will be accepted on a first come-first served basis as indicated by postmark date until classes are filled. Entries received after classes are filled will be notified and, if desired, put on a wait list in the order of postmark date. Those on the wait list **prior to closing date** who do not get into the show(s) will have all fees refunded except the office fee. Those entries postmarked **after** closing will be accepted at the discretion of management, based on class and schedule availability, and will be subject to a late fee. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry.

No refunds after the closing date. Before closing date, entries less office fees will be refunded. To claim any refund of other fees, please notify management in writing prior to closing date. All refunds will be mailed within 30 days after the competition; absolutely no refunds at show.

Competitors entering **Freestyle** classes (other than FEI Juniors or Young Riders) must provide a photocopy of a test (score 60% at the highest test of level) with their entry form(s) to verify eligibility.

A copy of horses' Coggins pulled within 12 months of the show date must accompany each entry. **Horse's name on Coggins MUST match name on entry form and cards**, per USEF rules (no barn names). Failure to include Coggins prior to show may result in incomplete entry fees per show and may result in elimination without return of fees. Additionally, at Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be **accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations** within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged **twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested. 5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.**

Opportunity classes are offered in Training and First Levels for entry level riders: cross-entry between the opportunity division and any other division is not allowed. Riders, owners, and trainers entered **only** in opportunity classes are exempt from both USDF and USEF membership requirements and are not required to pay a non-member fee, but **must** list their Federation number(s) if they have been assigned. Participants entered **only** in these classes are also exempt from the Equine Drugs and Medications Fee, however horses entered in these classes **are** subject to drug testing. Horses entered only in opportunity classes are not required to have a USEF or a USDF Horse Identification (HID) or Recording number, but **must** list the HID or Recording number if the horse has been assigned such a number.

Entries will be acknowledged by email, and **preliminary ride times** will be emailed prior to the competition and posted on the Fox Village (www.foxvillage.com) and Reiterhof (www.reiterhof.us) websites. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform management of any time conflicts as soon as possible. Official ride times for Show I will be posted at the show grounds by noon on Friday, May 5. Updates for Show II will be posted by noon on Saturday. Any changes after the closing date initiated by rider, owner, or trainer will incur a change fee.

Official ride times for Saturday (Show I) will be posted by noon Friday; official ride times for Sunday (Show II) will be posted by noon Saturday. It is the competitors' responsibility to check his/her official ride times for changes upon arrival at the show grounds, and to advise show management as soon as possible if there are conflicts in scheduled times.

Saddlery and all other rules will be in effect upon arrival to show grounds. **Anyone** mounted on a horse on the show grounds from noon the Friday before the beginning of competition until 7pm Sunday **MUST** wear protective headgear, **whether or not** they are entered in the competition.

A veterinarian and farrier will be on call each show day. Their names and numbers, as well as other emergency information, will be posted at the show office by noon Friday.

Pony Measurement If a pony needs to be measured at the competition (**please remember the Entry Secretary should be notified when the entry is submitted**) management will try to schedule the measurement on Friday afternoon. Affected competitors will be notified as to time and location. A pony does not exceed 148 cm without shoes and 149 cm with shoes. Any pony competing in classes limited to ponies **must** submit a copy of a USEF measurement certificate with its entry or arrange to be measured before competing.

Freestyle music (CDs) should be submitted at check-in on Friday, and in no case later than 7 a.m. the day of the class. Sound check times will be announced/posted each day. Competition management may not be held responsible for equipment failure or defective CDs. Sound system issues may not be allowed to delay the competition. Competitors are responsible for picking up their music before the end of the show.

Post-entries will be allowed on a space-available basis not disruptive to the show schedule. Applicable fees apply. No post entries will be allowed after a class has begun.

Classes may be scheduled out of order and each scheduled class must be run in its entirety. Riders may request to move to a time available due to a scratch within the same class.

Scratches of a class will receive no refund other than the SWDC qualifying fee in the event the scratched class was a qualifying ride. (USDF now requires shows to submit qualifying fees once the rides are scheduled even if the class is subsequently scratched). Scratches of a class **must be in writing**, and if at the show, with the show secretary. Scratches ("no shows") of the entire show after closing date are liable for all unpaid fees, including but not limited to entry and office fees, and will be billed accordingly.

Failure to enter the arena at the specified time will result in elimination. **No shows** that have not contacted the show office prior to their first ride will be considered scratched for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled from the wait list; reinstatement of rides, if slots available, may incur post-entry fees.

It is the competitors' responsibility to verify the accuracy of scores; scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary within **one** hour of official posting of the scores from the last class of the show day during which the score was earned.

Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered by the rules of the Federation or the rules and regulations of this prize list shall be decided by Horse Show Management, whose decision shall be final. Horse Show Management reserves unto itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel awards or prizes without claim to damages; to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, to change rings or officials, and to assess fees and or penalties.

NOTICE: All parties agree that it shall be a condition of entry these competitions that neither Reiterhof nor the Austin Equestrian Center, nor any owners, partners, employees, staff or volunteers connected with the competitions "Dressage at Cedar Creek I and II" will be responsible for any loss, personal injury or damage to persons, horses or property of any kind or to competitors, spectators, or any other third parties. Owners and competitors may be held personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, their horses, or others in their entourage, and are therefore advised to consider third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and away from home, and to keep liability coverages current.

Under Texas Law [Chapter 87 Civil Practice and Remedies Code] an equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risk of equine activities. Added by Acts 1995, 74th Leg., Ch. 549, 1, effective September 1, 1995.

Please note that **“Trainer Signature”** is **MANDATORY!**

USDF qualifying is now \$15 and SWDC qualifying is \$10

*****Arrival time at show grounds is no earlier than 12:00 pm Friday***
(unless additional days stabling has been arranged in advance)**

All USEF & USDF rules shall be enforced from the time the first competitor has arrived on the show grounds until the last competitor has left the grounds.

It is the duty of the rider to know the rules applying to showing in the Dressage Discipline. It is the competitor's responsibility to check the current 2018 USEF Rule Book for any rule changes. Refer to www.usef.org for more information on current rules.

In accordance with DR126.1b(3) Competitions may reserve the right to fill a competitor's subsequent ride times if that competitor fails to notify the competition secretary of his/her intention to scratch (i.e. a “no show”). **Scratches MUST be reported to SHOW SECRETARY (not to ring steward or announcer!) or ride will be deemed a no-show*****

Effective April 1, 2013: In accordance with DR120.6 From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse, including all non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests must wear protective headgear as defined by GR801.

Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is out of its stall. Each horse/rider combination is considered a separate entry and will be issued an individual number. Any horse wearing a number not assigned by management will be eliminated from the show **in accordance with DR124.1a**

In accordance with GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. ***The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation.*** Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6.

In accordance DR121.9: Ring Stewards will check saddlery and inspect bits and spurs on both sides of the horse for at least one-third of the horses in each class. Inspection of saddlery and bits must be done immediately as the horse leaves the arena. **Legal whip length is 47.2” at all times while on show grounds.**

Sharps containers are located in each barn. In accordance with USEF GR1210.4 Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

In case of cancellation of show due to acts of God, terrorism or other emergency, the show will be rescheduled, dates to be determined. No refunds of office fees.

*****Normal arrival time at show grounds is no earlier than 12:00 pm Friday*****

Early arrivals will be charged \$60 per stall/per day and management **MUST** be notified 2 days in advance of early arrival. Contact Susan Howard at 512-423-4424

All riders and trainers (except when mounted), coaches, grooms, friends and associates of a competitor must stand behind the railings of all riding and warm-up areas except when lunging. When lunging, only the person lunging the horse shall be in the lunging area

*****A \$20 incomplete entry fee per show will be charged for all entries received which do not include copies of all required USEF/USDF cards*****

The **expiration date of a Coggins** test is one year from the "blood drawn on date". The name of the horse on the coggins must match the name on the entry form.

****\$50.00 stall change fee** for anyone changing stalls without prior permission of management. **If you use an empty stall FOR ANY REASON OR FOR ANY LENGTH OF TIME you will be assessed an \$110 stall fee, NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Management reserves the right to split, combine, delete, or add classes dependent on entries. **Management also reserves the right to add or substitute judges** or make any changes required by circumstances. Management may also limit the number of entries if required by circumstances.

Lunging is allowed in designated areas only.

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events.

NO AWARDS OR RIBBONS WILL BE MAILED. You must be present to pick up your awards/ribbons.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USDF, USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not count toward national awards.

2018 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2018 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record. A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- **Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm (with Active Farm Owner)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.**

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.

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USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.) Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]USDF Year-End Awards, USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Education Membership (EM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online-education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$50. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan[®]USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

New for 2018 LIFELINE RULE

To exercise the Lifeline rule a horse/rider combination must have already achieved one SWDC minimum qualifying score at a level and division where the SWDC fee was paid before the ride at an SWDC approved competition. If the horse rider combination failed to pay the qualifying fee at another competition this lifeline may be exercised. The rider may pay a fee of \$75 to SWDC and send the fee, along with the score or USDF record of score to the SWDC qualifying secretary to count as a second qualifying score. The second score must have been earned at an in-region SWDC-approved competition at the same level/division and satisfy the minimum score for the Level/division where the SWDC qualifying fee was not paid before the ride in which the score was earned.

The intent to qualify for a specific division must be designated on the entry form and the qualifying fee PAID before the ride at a qualifying show.

See www.swdressage.org for complete SWDC Rules

Important Considerations for Qualifying

1. A horse/rider combination may qualify for the SWDC Championship by earning two qualifying scores in qualifying classes at SWDC recognized shows during the SWDC qualifying year. Qualifying classes are the highest test at each level, with the exception of Walk/Trot which will use Intro Test B. Winning or placing in the class is

not necessary as long as the score is earned. These scores must be earned at two different competitions from two different judges.

2. An \$10.00 fee is added to the regular entry fee when entering a Qualifying Class at an SWDC recognized competition. \$1.00 of the fee is to provide for the volunteers' services at the Championships, \$5.00 of this fee is allocated for prize money at the Championships, and the remaining \$4.00 will be used to help pay for awards (any of the \$4.00 not used for prizes will be added to the prize money).
3. One score may be earned at a show that is not approved by the SWDC as long as:
 - a. The show is outside of Region 9 and recognized by USEF/USDF.
 - b. The rider submits the score (a copy of the front of a signed dressage test) and a fee of \$25.00 to the SWDC Qualifying Secretary within two weeks of the end of the competition. If the score is not received within the two weeks, it will not apply.
4. A horse/rider combination having won the Championships at a certain level and division may not compete at that level and division or below in the Championships in subsequent years (except Grand Prix). However, the horse may compete at any level with a different rider.
5. Riders in the Walk/Trot level must not have competed in a recognized show above First Level.
6. Each rider must declare the division in which they are competing prior to each attempt at a qualifying ride at SWDC qualifying shows or for a score submitted under Rule 4 (Amateur, Open, or Junior/Young Rider) and must provide proof of eligibility in the case of Amateur and Junior/Young Rider. The intent to qualify for a particular division must be designated on the entry form. Adult Amateur, Junior/Young Riders and Ponies may also qualify for the Open division. Separate qualifying scores must be earned for each division. At the SWDC Championships they must enter each division separately and will ride in each division separately. If a competitor is found to have entered a division in which they are **NOT ELIGIBLE** they must default to show in the Open division if their qualifying scores are sufficient to qualify in that division.
7. In qualifying classes with more than one judge, scores among the judges of the ride will be averaged. For purposes of obtaining qualifying scores from two judges, so long as one judge in the judging combination is changed, it will constitute a different judge.
8. Qualifying rides must be ridden in an unmodified standard 20m x 60m arena with the exception of walk/trot which may be ridden in a 20m x 40m arena.
9. Competitors wishing to qualify for the Training or First Level Open Pony Championships may ride a qualifying test at Training or First Level in any division. These qualifying scores do not have to be earned in classes restricted to ponies but the competitor must declare prior to the start of the ride their intent to qualify for the SWDC Pony Championship class. Failure to do so will result in the default to the open division. Ponies must meet height requirements set by the USEF (DR135) in order to be eligible for this division at the Championships.
10. Junior Riders may qualify for the SWDC Open Third Level Freestyle Championship Class using qualifying scores obtained from Junior Rider Freestyle and Young Riders may qualify for the SWDC Open FEI Level Freestyle class using the Young Riders Freestyle. Scores must meet the division percentages and the rider must state the intention to qualify for those classes and pay qualifying fees PRIOR TO THE RIDE.
11. Competitors may check scores by checking www.swdressage.org web site or by emailing the SWDC Qualifying Secretary, at qualifying@swdressage.org. To permit recording, scores will not be available until at least three weeks after the competition.

Federation Entry Agreement
